What is Eye Cooperative?

The Eye Cooperative program is a need-based program created to provide a basic pair of eyeglasses to those in need. We offer our service on a sliding scale based on need to our uninsured and under-insured clients.

Eyeglasses

Our eyeglasses are provided by our labs and local retail optical stores in our network who support our efforts to help those in need to see better.

Submit Eligibility Form

After you submit your application and pay your \$20 registration fee, you will be notified in 3 business days to complete your eligibility form.

You will receive your eligibility form by email or fax. (We do not mail the forms.) Complete the form and return.

Current eyeglass prescription is required.

Referral to Optical Store

After we receive your eligibility form (s) you will be notified of the optical store you need to go to select and order your eyeglasses. Your eyeglasses will be ready in 14 business days.

You must pick up your eyeglasses within 3 days of notification.

There are no refunds, exchanges or warranties on eyeglasses.

NOTE: In some cases when network providers are not available, we will order your eyeglasses from our in-network optical lab. Your eyeglasses will be mailed to you.

Eye Cooperative is a non profit organization whose mission is to help those in need to get a basic pair of eyeglasses through our gift of sight program.

Eye Cooperative is an all volunteer organization which means everyone involved are volunteers who give their time and effort to provide this service for those who are in need.



Important Tips

- *\$20 registration fee to participate in the program. This fee is non-refundable*
- Payment can be paid online or by phone using debit or credit card. Money orders are accepted.
- This is not an income based program. Eyeglasses referral cost is based on a sliding scale determined by need.
- You must be referred from a community agency (Dept. of Social Services, etc.)
- This program is for eyeglass assistance; participants must have a current prescription in order to receive assistance.
